#### From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time and we first hear a strange reading that moves from an outpouring of grace that yields to mourning and grieving. How does "grace" lead to mourning? The answer points to the mysterious nature of the will of God. God may allow certain things to occur, even awful things that clearly violate his will, but the evil done is never the end of the story because God never ceases being an agent in human affairs. Listen to today's reading and we hear the prophet Zachariah speak of chastisement and doom, but in reality, he is prophesying hope and repentance that lead to salvation. The people's hearts have been opened and suddenly they realize the calamity they perpetrated. Sometimes it is the very awareness of our sins that leads us to God. Today we're told that those who opposed God's servant will look upon his wounded body and regret what they have done.

Paul is discussing our current and former states—before and after grace, but today we only hear about our current state. His image of being clothed in Christ describes a profound reality. Jesus is not just a peripheral aspect of who we now are, he is our whole identity. We are covered in Christ; defined and transformed by him. These readings all tell us that instead of our distinct identities defined by race, ethnicity, social status and gender, we wear a common identity and that is Christ. We can stop focusing on what differentiates us and focus instead on what unites us: Jesus.

Typical of Luke, Jesus is at prayer prior to a significant moment in his ministry. In today's narrative, two things occur: Peter's confession and Jesus' first prediction of his Passion. Perhaps in his prayer he may have prayed about the approaching menace of his suffering and death

and sensed, perhaps, the great threat to the disciples' faith that would follow. Prior to that they would need a strong grasp of his identity or they might be scattered. Here Luke differs from Mark & Matthew. In those gospels, when Jesus predicts his Passion following Peter's confession, Peter refuses to believe the prediction and is rebuked by the Lord. Here, there is no rejection or rebuke. Luke's Jesus is more confident of his disciples than is Matthew or Mark's.

The wedding season is in full swing here at St. Patrick's. Again this year, we have a number of visiting priests as celebrants. I hope everyone knows that anytime you want to request another priest for a wedding, funeral, etc., they are more than welcome here.

April, May and June have seen a bumper number of baptisms here. Great to see all of these young families in the parish.

Today is Father's Day and we all send best wishes to our fathers and grandfathers, and we pause to remember those whom we have returned to the Lord. Today's bulletin contains the names of fathers and grandfathers whom you wish particularly remembered in our Masses this weekend.

CARA, Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate, is located at Georgetown University and recently released a lengthy report on American Catholicism. Among its findings is the fact that among people who were raised Catholic, two-thirds remain Catholic, 16% have become Protestant, 15% have no religious affiliation and 3% are affiliated with a non-Christian faith. The study also shows that among those who remain Catholic, 25% attend Mass weekly, 24% less than weekly but at least once a month, 29% less than monthly but at least once a year and 22% never attend Mass. The study also addressed the life-cycle of religion which shows that as people

become teens and then adults, their religiosity falls as they leave childhood patterns of affiliation and worship. Then as people age they may marry and have children and as this happens many become more religious and strongly affiliated. Finally, as they age and move into their senior years, religiosity rises even further.

Among Black Catholics, only 52% who were raised Catholic remain Catholic, but among those who stay, Mass attendance is extremely high. At the same time, the retention rate among Hispanic and Latino Catholics is much higher than among other race or ethnicity.

Only 56% of those raised Catholic who identify as gay, lesbian or bisexual remain Catholic as adults. Among those who stay only about 35% attend Mass at least once a month. The conclusion about gay, lesbian and bisexuals raised Catholic who no longer attend is both the teachings of the church and overwhelming sense that they do not feel welcome in the church or in a parish.

The final section has to do with parish satisfaction and it shows that over 90% of Catholics are satisfied with their parish. The survey says this is because Catholics seek out a parish that meets their needs rather than simply going to their territorial parish. The territorially defined parishes of the past are fast becoming something of the past. When asked what attracts them to a parish, 86% said "a parish's open and welcoming spirit." The other two factors drawing them to a parish are the quality of the liturgy and the quality of the preaching.



#### 89 DAYS TO THE IRISH FESTIVAL

## IRISH TO THE BONE, AND THEN SOME.

Not all of the volunteers who work at the Erie Irish Festival are truly volunteers—about a dozen of them at any given moment are paying a debt to society by helping out—they are parolees from the county justice system—non-violent guys who made big mistakes and are trying to work off that debt to society through grunt work and clean-up. But it's the guy who gets them here that this article is about. Jack Maloney has been an Erie County adult parole and probation officer for 33 years and a member of St. Patrick's Parish for even longer.

Jack goes back a couple of generations in this town--Irish generations. His dad, Jocko Maloney, was a Fire Captain at the French Street Station and the "Mayor" of 4th Street. During parades, high school bands stopped in front of their house at 4<sup>th</sup> and French and played Irish tunes in his honor. Jack's grandparents had 7 children graduate from St. Patrick's School. Jack and his brother. Tim. and sister. Patti Fiorelli (How Italian husband, Ray, managed to get her hand in marriage from Irish Jocko is probably another story) all graduated from St. Pat's as well and Jack's 50<sup>th</sup> reunion is coming up this July 16. Jack's the VP of the alumni association and St. Pat's School reunions do a lot to raise money for the church and for the food pantry. And Jack's an usher at the 8:00 Sunday mass and was inducted into the Knights and Ladies in 2013 to honor his service to the church and to the Erie community. During Festival time, you'll find Jack helping Randy Pristello and Dave Taccone serve up that Guinness and Harp, and then lending a hand to Stan and Roselle Walkiewicz in the tough job of teardown.

These days, Jack coordinates the community service program that brings in the extra help from the justice system and has served on Drug and Alcohol and DUI Advisory Boards. He and his wife, Tina, have two lovely daughters, Caitlin and Mollie, and are the proud parents of a senior citizen—Loxie, their dog.

So, next time you're tossing your envelope into the donation basket early on a Sunday morning, look up at the guy on the other end of the pole and say, "Hey, Jack, thanks for all you do."
