From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time and we read first from the Book of Numbers, the fourth book of the Pentateuch, Numbers is a loose collection of accounts related to the Hebrews wandering in the wilderness. It includes several census lists, "numbering" of the people that gives the book its name, several trials including lack of food and water and clashes with various peoples the Hebrews encountered on their way into Canaan. Immediately before today's reading, Moses has grown exasperated with the people's unrest. Tiring of manna, they have complained about the lack of meat. Moses in turn laments to God about his own perceived ill treatment pleading that he cannot carry the burden of the entire people by himself. After promising Moses an abundance of meat, God tells him to gather 70 elders. When Moses has done so. God comes down to share his divine power with them. When two of those who have been called but were tardy also receive a share of the divine spirit, Joshua objects. Moses tells his young aid not to attempt to restrict any sharing of God's spirit.

Today's passage from James shifts from instruction on how to live to warnings for those who ignore such teaching. Today's warning is to those who amass great wealth.

Mark has structured the middle section of his gospel to stress both Jesus's identity as the Messiah who must suffer and die and the disciples failure to grasp this reality. Peter's confession of faith in Jesus as Messiah and his refusal to connect that identity with Jesus' impending death marks the beginning of this threefold section. In each part, Jesus first announces his coming suffering and death; then the disciples give evidence that they do not wish to understand the message and finally Jesus attempts to further Saint Hedwig Parish

instruct the disciples. What is happening is that the disciples are saying that they would rather dictate to God. Gehenna was the valley of ben Hinnom below Jerusalem, which served as the city dump and where a fire burned continually...

It's so nice and quiet around here this weekend after all of the activity of last weekend.

A special thanks to Angie Kontur, chair of this year's festival and the assistant chairs, Gary & Becky Johnson. Their leadership was invaluable and you can see that from the results. Thanks also to the large number of you who volunteered, who chaired a committee, who brought family and friends. As much as the festival is a fund raiser for the parish & our food pantry, it builds community among parishioners and it is this that I value.

The diocesan insurance company is re-appraising St. Patrick's Church and rectory this week. It has been several years since this was done, and all of the buildings in the diocese are being reappraised. At the present time, St. Patrick's Church is insured for \$18 million but that would be a drop in the bucket if it had to be replaced. The Conrad Schmitt Studios who did the restoration are probably the foremost church restoration firm in the country and they told me to replace the building today would be a minimum of \$48 million.

The St. Patrick's Food Pantry distributed 15,265 pounds of food during August. Cost to the parish was \$1,241 and 637 families were served including 392 elderly and 846 children.

A new study by the Pew Research Center shows widespread dissent from moral teachings of the church among American Catholics. Seventy-nine percent approve of artificial birth control; 43% feel that same sex couples should be able to raise children; and 39% do not believe that homosexual acts are sinful.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

Bishop Persico is going to meet with all of the Erie priests for a day-long meeting on October 27th at which time the restructuring of Catholic schools in the city will be announced. Once that phase is announced, he will meet with us again to announce the restructuring of parishes in the city. After that, the entire process will begin all over again in other areas of the diocese. While the announcement of parish reconfiguration will take place before the end of the year, the final move will not take place until September 2016.

The new Young Adults group at St. Patrick's are meeting for their first Happy Hour tonite. I told them for their first gathering, they can use the rectory and I will treat for wine and beer. The group is purely social in nature and intended to gather young people—single or married—who are in their 20s and 30s to get together for a variety of things.

We're having problems with a broken pipe in the rectory. It's coming from my kitchen on the third floor and the water worked its way down to cause the ceiling in my office on the first floor to collapse. When you have a hundred year old house, there's a new leak every month!

The chairs of all of the committees on the recent Irish Festival are going to gather at the rectory this week to critique and review the event. We had talked about moving the festival to an earlier date, but it appears more and more that September is shaping up to be one of the nicest months of the summer and perhaps we should just stay where we are. We are also exploring the possibility of another type of raffle rather than that of a trip to Ireland.
